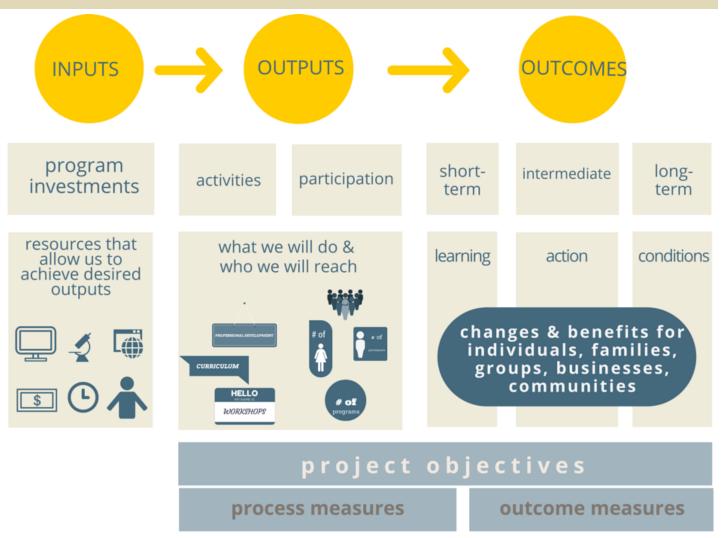
overview

Today's results-driven research environment often mandates an evaluation component in a proposal submission. With increasing regularity, federal agencies and private foundations ask researchers to plan for program monitoring and to link outcomes to original objectives. Articulating your project's objectives and goals will help your evaluator craft a rigorous evaluation that is tailored to your work, your stakeholders' needs, and your project's timelines.
